## Cancer center, LeBauer open in High Point

Residents of north High Point now have two more options for receiving care close to home.

LeBauer HealthCare has opened a new primary care practice, and Moses Cone Health System has opened a satellite office of its regional cancer center. Both facilities are located at Moses Cone Health System's new MedCenter High Point at 2630 Willard Dairy Road, just off N.C. 68.

Oncologist Peter Ennever is leading an eight-member staff at the cancer center. Radiology services are not part of the new facility, but patients have full access to the research and clinical trials that Moses Cone Regional Cancer Center is involved in through its various partnerships. The office has eight chemotherapy chairs, six exam rooms, a pharmacy for preparing the special medicines used in cancer treatments and a laboratory. "The new cancer center is full service with complete lab and chemotherapy capabilities," Ennever said in a press release. "We are closely linked to all Moses Cone health care facilities and can easily access higher level care if needed."

Moses Cone hopes the satellite office will alleviate some crowding at its main service center, as well as making care more convenient for patients from north High Point.

"We draw a lot of people from that area," says Jim Whiting, vice president, oncology, Moses Cone Health System. "We want to make our services more convenient to people who live nearby."

Convenience is also the driver behind LeBauer's newest practice. Drs. LauraLee Wilson and Robert Yoo are accepting new patients at the location.

LeBauer has been providing medical care to people in the Triad for more than 75 years, now operating locations in Greensboro, Reidsville, Eden, Stoney Creek and now High Point.
