# Pavilions grow Carolinas HealthCare System's footprint

System expects six ER projects to employ more than 300

**Carolinas HealthCare System will spend more than \$103 million during the next few years to dramatically expand its emergency services in Charlotte's suburbs.**

Under the strategy, **the hospital system wants to build a half dozen free-standing emergency facilities in outlying communities** throughout the region.

The emergency departments, which will anchor medical office complexes called health-care pavilions, will be the first of their type in this market.

**The initial facility, called CMC-Steele Creek, is slated to open in October.** State regulators have also given the **system approval to build health-care pavilions in Waxhaw, Harrisburg, Kannapolis and Huntersville.** And Carolinas HealthCare submitted plans to N.C. regulators last month to **construct one in Mount Holly.**
